Getting Older, Getting Wiser


How to deal with some of the important legal and social issues facing all of us as we make our way through life.

Beverly is an attorney with over 20 years of legal experience who is engaged in private practice with Beverly J. White, P.A. She handles a variety of matters including Medicaid planning and eligibility, estate planning, trusts, wills, powers of attorney, health care advance directives, and Probate. Beverly is a member of the Florida Bar, the Michigan State Bar and a member of the Elder Law section and Real Property, Probate and Trust Law section of the Florida Bar. She is also a member of the National Academy of Elder Law Attorneys, the Academy of Florida Elder Law Attorneys and is active in numerous elder-related groups. She belongs to the Hillsborough County Bar Association, the Family Law Inns of Court and is on the Board of Directors of Better Living for Seniors, an affiliate of the District Area Agency on Aging of Pinellas and Pasco Counties, Florida and the West Central Florida Area Agency on Aging.

Beverly is a frequent speaker for professional organizations and local civic groups and enjoys sharing information of interest to and about the senior sector of our population. She also is very interested in the arts. She served for a number of years on the Hillsborough Public Arts Committee and is now on the Advisory Board of the Florida Center for Creative Aging.

Originally from Michigan, Beverly is a graduate of Michigan State University and the University of Detroit School of Law. Before moving to Florida, she practiced as a trial attorney for a number of years.


