

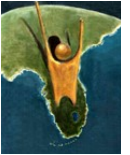

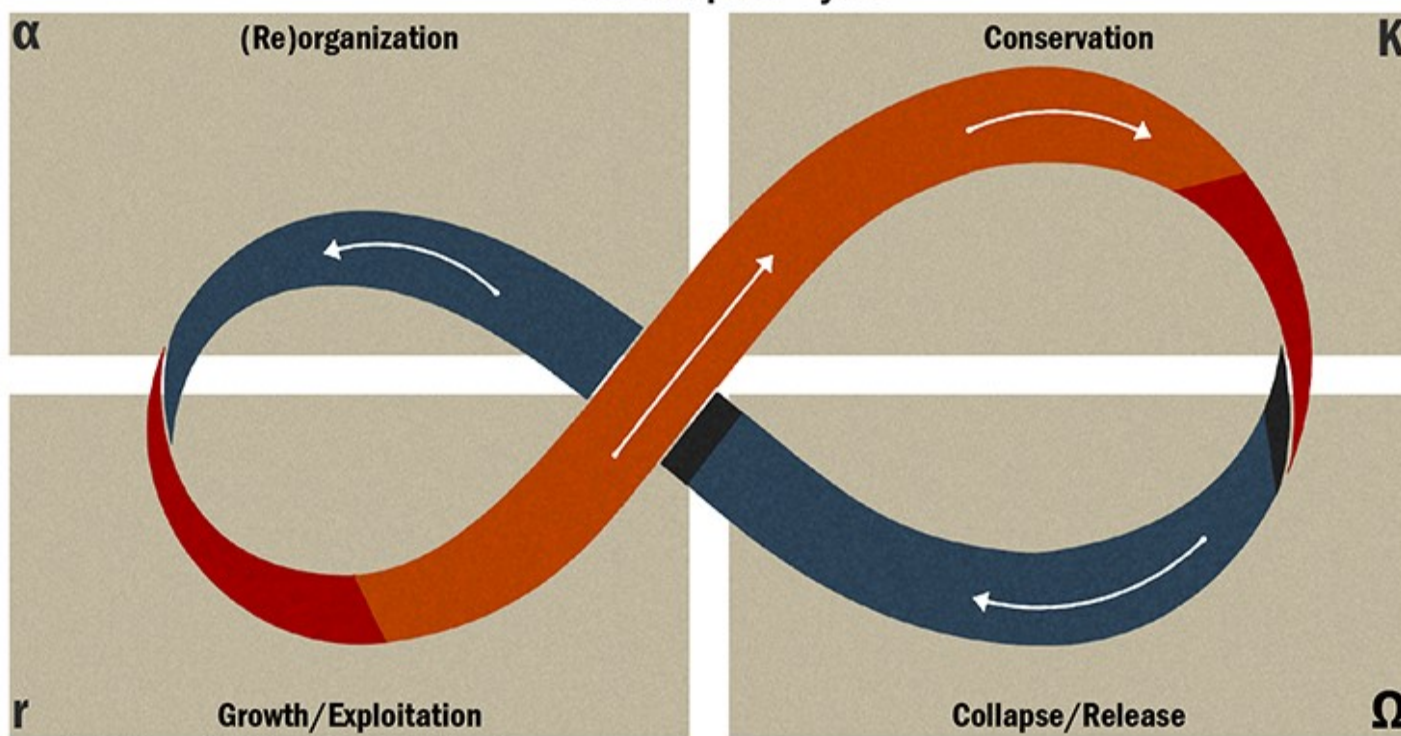

What is Resilience?

Resilience is a rich and complex concept. It has roots in [systems theory](#), and it has a variety of interpretations and applications including for ecosystems management, disaster preparedness, and even community planning. Our interpretation is based on the work of the [Resilience Alliance](#), the leading scholarly body working on the resilience of social-ecological systems. In that field, resilience is commonly [defined](#) as *the capacity of a system to absorb disturbance and re-organize while undergoing change so as to still retain essentially the same function, structure, identity, and feedbacks.*

Resilience.org is a program of [Post Carbon Institute](#) (PCI). From 2004 to 2012 the site was known as “Energy Bulletin.” Over the years Energy Bulletin broadened its coverage from peak oil and energy to include other resource depletion, related issues, and articles which describe, encourage or educate on meaningful responses — in essence, the task of building resilience. From this came the inspiration to create **resilience.org**, which combines the best of the Energy Bulletin with the addition of sections for Groups engaged in building resilience, and Resources — a combination of user-generated and Post Carbon Institute media and reports. In January 2009, Energy Bulletin was adopted as a core program by the [Post Carbon Institute](#) and in 2012 relaunched as resilience.org. Except for PCI, resilience.org is unaffiliated with any private, government, or institutional body.

Free Speech & Checked Privilege: Tough Topics Tackled on Reasonable Talk & Point of Inquiry

Reasonable Talk, CFI’s web video series of great presentations from Center for Inquiry events, has two new episodes from 2016’s Women in Secularism 4, & both focus on the very contentious topic of free speech.



First, writer & activist Soraya Chemaly explodes the myth of the Internet as a great equalizer, an unbiased marketplace of ideas. Instead, Chemaly says that the online space reflects the values of those who designed it: largely white males.

When women face such hostility online simply for making their concerns heard, the Internet looks to Chemaly like a “safe space” for the denizens of Reddit.

Next is Wendy Kaminer, a veteran writer & social critic within the freethought movement, whose talk argues for a more purist approach to free speech in the public sphere. She is critical of the goals of social justice advocates on speech & “safe spaces,” contrasting their “goal-oriented” approach to that of civil libertarians, who she says are “process-oriented.”

Also, on CFI’s podcast Point of Inquiry, Lindsay Beyerstein is joined by Phoebe Maltz Bovy to tackle the equally thorny issue of “privilege,” the systemic advantages some groups of people have over others. Bovy discusses the necessity of being aware of one’s own blind spots due to privilege but cautions that constantly being advised to “check one’s privilege” can backfire & cause confusion & insult.

The latest update on the Teacher Institute for Evolutionary Science (TIES) features this report from a North Dakota workshop leader who said, “I saw genuine relief for the support offered in this unit-based presentation you prepared.”

Science & journalism don't always see eye to eye. Scientific accuracy is often sacrificed in the quest for an enticing headline, but at a time when [fake news](#) is on the rise, high quality scientific reporting has never been more essential.

As the House of Commons science & technology select committee, which I chair, [argues in its latest report](#), if the press is to maintain the public's trust, journalists must demonstrate their commitment to clear & unbiased reporting of scientific facts – & be given the necessary support by policymakers to do so.

The idea that 'science sells' is not part of the average journalist's lexicon. Add a sensationalist headline, & a political angle, however, & you can produce a trending & controversial piece of journalism that sparks debate – a result both for the media outlet & the journalist.

But while selling papers & driving online traffic is a media priority, it rarely aligns with the scientific endeavour behind the headlines. More often than not, scientists are looking to provide the public with greater clarity, rather than confuse or further mystify the topic of their research.

This phenomenon is nothing new. While the row over the [MMR vaccine](#) was making front-page news, such large numbers of parents decided to avoid vaccinations that the UK's child immunisation programme was put at risk. Genetically-modified crops were long ago classed by the tabloids as '[Frankenstein](#)' foods to be avoided at all costs, rather than a potential solution to sporadic famine & food poverty. We may never know if [the burger fed to four year-old Cordelia Gummer](#) during the mad cow disease crisis in 1990 was really safe to eat. What we do know is that there was a political & media motivation for it to be consumed.

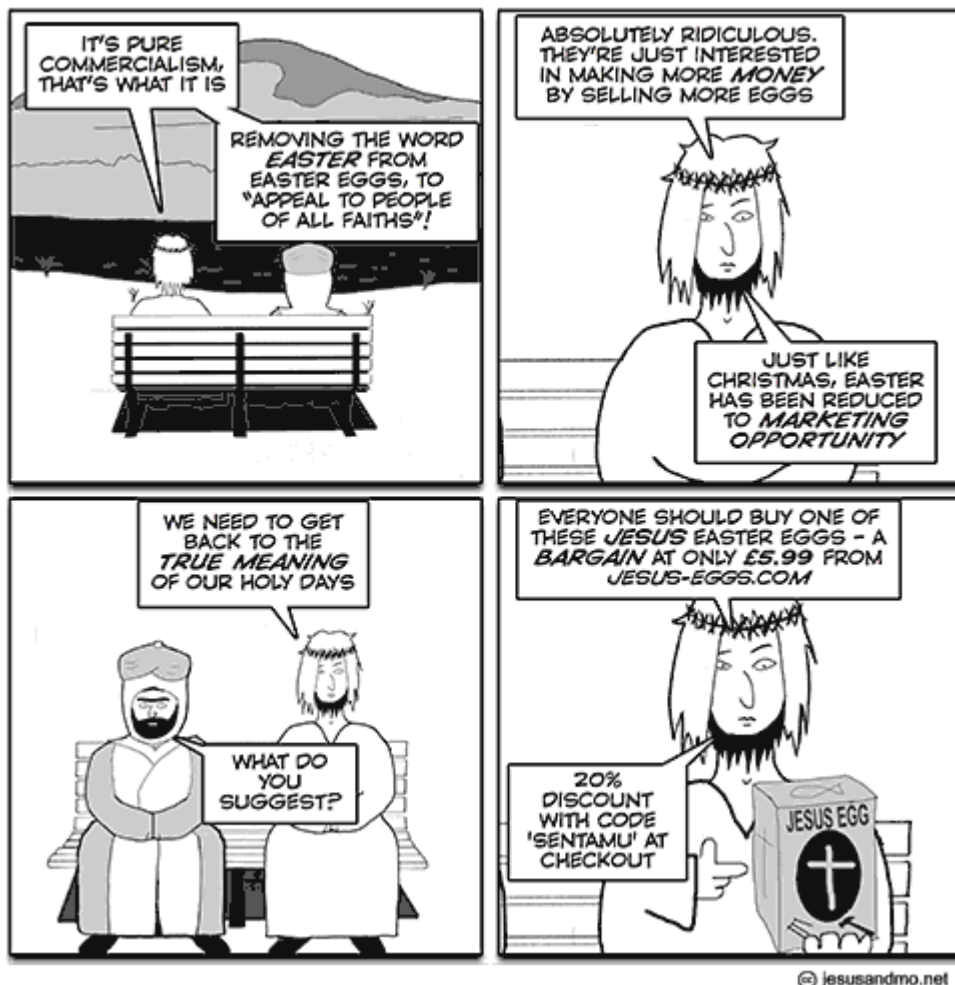
Climate change has not escaped this treatment either. Media coverage of climate often gives [equal prominence to opposing viewpoints](#), leading an uninformed public to believe that the evidence for & against has equal weight. A distinction must be made between impartiality & neutrality; between taking sides based on the evidence, & refusing to take sides at all.

Perhaps the most acute example is the number of everyday items claimed – rightly or wrongly – to have carcinogenic properties. [Deodorant](#), [vitamin E](#), [chips](#), [tomatoes](#) & even [Facebook](#) have been reported in the UK media to increase your chances of developing cancer. Compare this to the number of reports on cigarettes & UV exposure – both well-known & proven causes – & you might be surprised.

As the ability to proliferate & share news increases, & our reliance on traditional media declines, we run the risk that a plurality of perspectives takes precedence over accuracy. This is a dangerous environment to exist in.

It would also be wrong to scapegoat the public for a lack of interest in science, or for not being able to understand the often complex concepts involved. The overwhelming majority of people in the UK have a strong desire to know how science affects their daily lives, but seventy-one per cent believe the media sensationalises science, & sixty-seven per cent say they have no option but to trust those governing scientific information. Major New Avenues for the Freethought Trail

The **Freethought Trail** is a series of historic sites in West-Central New York (and a deeply researched website) that tell the story of the progressive & radical movements of the nineteenth century, such as secularism & freethought, abolition of slavery, women's suffrage, & more. A project of CFI's **Council for Secular Humanism**, Freethought Trail has just completed its largest-ever expansion, now featuring 108 sites across 26 cities & towns!

This expansion includes a great deal of additional coverage of the **abolitionist movement**, as well as the inclusion of two new reform causes: **dress reform** & **Fourierist utopianism** (a movement of communities that rejected private property & embraced labor pursuits based on one's "proclivities"). There is new material on dress reform activist **Mary Edwards Walker** (statue pictured), a physician who was also America's only female Medal of Honor winner; philanthropist **William Smith**, founder of the William Smith College for Women, freethinker, & champion of women's rights; suffragist **Harriet May Mills**, the first woman to seek major statewide office as a candidate of a major political party; & much more.

CFI Calls Out America's Lapse in Leadership at UN Human Rights Council

In 2014, the United States' representative to the Council was among those who spoke up strongly in defense of CFI's representative **Josephine Macintosh** when **Saudi Arabia attempted to silence her** as she spoke out against Saudis' human rights abuses (the Saudi representative shouting, "I ask you to shut her up!"). But now in 2017, Michael warned that **the U.S. is abdicating its leadership role** in the defense of human rights. "We have been disturbed by the recent rise in baseless, xenophobic rhetoric & actions by political leaders, & heightened social hostilities, in many states—including our home country," said Michael. "Across the country, there has also been a wave of proposals to criminalize protests, & an increase in threats & attacks—some deadly—on religious minorities." [See video of his statement here.](#)

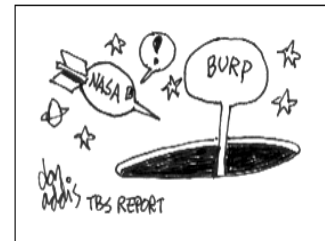

The Full Facts on Cold Reading

A recent article in *The New Yorker* magazine related the history of "criminal profiling" in reviewing a new book by famous FBI profiler **John Douglas**. "Profiling" is the use of behavioral analysis in attempting to create a psychological portrait of a serial killer based on the pattern of his acts & the nature of his victims. The reviewer compared criminal profiling to the art of cold reading, a process used by many psychics & seers in making seemingly incredible observations about their subjects/victims. "How did she know that about me?" "How could she possibly have known that I had a one-armed uncle named Rudy?"

The difference between criminal profiling & psychic readings, however, is that FBI profilers are not consciously trying to fool their audiences, whereas many (if not most) psychics are. This newsletter has mentioned on several occasions the art of cold reading by fortunetellers, who use tricks & "hot & cold" strategies in getting clients to believe that the psychics are able, through paranormal means, to discern personal attributes & past histories about them. What caught my attention in this review, however, was a reference to a book by the British magician & mentalist Ian Rowland called *The Full Facts Book of Cold Reading*. Self-published by him & available through [his website](#), the book is a comprehensive treasure trove of information about the entire subject. Since skeptics are often faced with allegations that psychics (John Edward, Sylvia Browne, etc.) can perform paranormal feats of fortune telling, I highly recommend that TBS members go online & order this fascinating book.

What struck me most in reading this book was the depth of knowledge & training needed to become a really good cold reader. We all know that a cold reader uses vague statements & guesses to get the subject of the reading to provide feedback & allow the psychic to zero in on specific facts. I had no idea, however, of the many techniques that a good reader must have

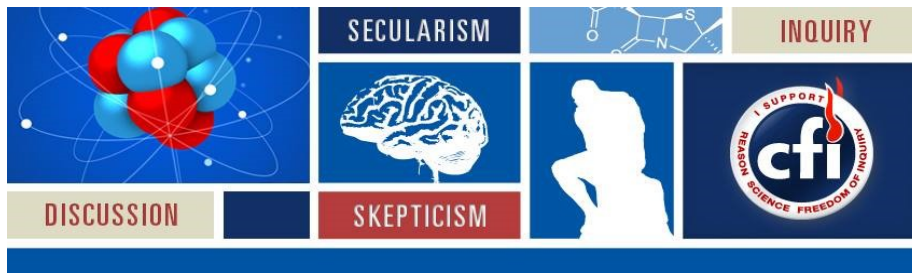

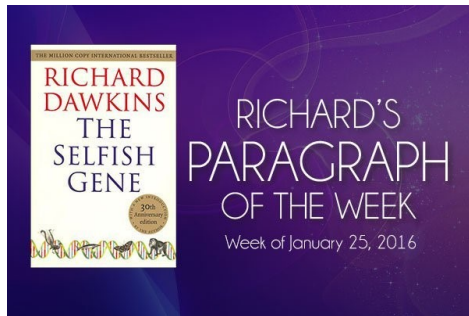

Genes work by controlling protein synthesis. This is a powerful way of manipulating the world, but it is slow. It takes months of patiently pulling protein strings to build an embryo. The whole point about behaviour, on the other hand, is that it is fast. It works on a time-scale not of months but of seconds & fractions of seconds. Something happens in the world, an owl flashes overhead, a rustle in the long grass betrays prey, & in milliseconds nervous systems crackle into action, muscles leap, & someone's life is saved—or lost. Genes don't have reaction-times like that. Like the &romedans, the genes can only do their best *in advance by building a fast executive computer for themselves, & programming it in advance with rules & 'advice' to cope with as many eventualities as they can 'anticipate'.* But life, like the game of chess, offers too many different possible eventualities for all of them to be anticipated. Like the chess programmer, the genes have to 'instruct' their survival machines not in specifics, but in the general strategies & tricks of the living trade.

Killing Science and Culture Doesn't Make the Nation Stronger

Massive funding cuts in the president's proposed budget could be more devastating than any threat posed by illegal immigrants By [Lawrence M. Krauss](#) on March 21, 2017

Scientists throughout the country across a wide spectrum of fields, from biochemists to physicists, are bemoaning the potentially devastating impact on science and technology in the United States of President Trump's proposed budget request to Congress. As much as the scientific enterprise, and with it the development of new technologies necessary for the long term economic health and security of the nation will be hobbled should the budget requests be approved, the budget—which purports to strengthen our security via large increases in national defense and homeland security—paradoxically undermines the nation's fundamental strength by presenting a broad attack on our culture that could be more devastating than any threat posed by a wave of illegal immigrants.

The President's budget reflects a consistent and fundamental vision about American strength that is fundamentally at odds with a vision presented by almost 50 years ago by the physicist Robert Wilson, the first director of the Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory near Chicago at which a large particle accelerator was being built. When testifying before Congress about the machine and its cost, Wilson was asked if its completion would aid in the defense of the nation. His answer is striking.

No Sir...I don't believe so.... It has only to do with the respect with which we regard one another, the dignity of men, our love of culture... It has to do with are we good painters, good sculptors, great poets? I mean all the things we really venerate in our country and are patriotic about. **It has nothing to do directly with defending our country except to make it worth defending.**

The President's budget will cut \$900 million—20 percent—from the budget of the Department of Energy's Office of Science, which is the chief funding agency for all of fundamental physical science research at US Universities and National Laboratories. It will also eliminate the \$296 million combined budgets of the National Endowment for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Humanities, the major federal funding agencies for arts development and humanities research in the country. It will also cut the \$230 million budget of the Institute of Museum and Library Services, which supports libraries and museums across the country and would eliminate the \$445 million budget for the Corporation for Public Broadcasting.

Together these cuts total \$1.87 billion from the \$4 trillion total budget. At the same time \$2 billion was added to the total budget to cover an initial down payment on the President's proposed border wall with Mexico, and amount that exceeds the cumulative cost of all the above cuts by over \$100 million.

Suggesting that cutting or eliminating the essential scientific and cultural infrastructure of the country in order to pay for a wall with Mexico, whose purpose and effectiveness has always been in doubt, is more than a facile comparison. It reflects the essentially flawed view of this administration about what is required to preserve American greatness: a laser focus on the defense of the nation in its most literal terms, including military superiority and secure borders, independent of whatever real or perceived threats may exist.

But it is here where Wilson's answer to Congress is so important. Inherent in defending the nation is having a nation worth defending. This view is not new. It goes back at least as far as our founding fathers. As Thomas Jefferson wrote in an 1820 letter to Joseph Cabell, a Virginia politician who Jefferson recruited to help him endow funds to create the University of Virginia: *All the States but our own are sensible that knowledge is power.*

Whether or not knowledge alone is power is debatable. But the spirit of Jefferson's remarks is not. Whether future historians will view the United States as a truly great nation will not depend upon our military strength or our ability to successfully assimilate immigrants, any more than we celebrate the greatness of ancient Greece or Rome by counting their military victories. As for those civilizations whose contributions to art, literature, and science provided the heritage on which modern western civilization is based, our greatness will be judged by our contributions toward subsequent human progress.

Science has an essential advantage of creating associated technologies that power the economic engines of modern society. But the essential value of science for the human condition is not different from that of art, music, and literature. All of these cause us to reflect upon, and sometimes change our perspective of our place in the cosmos, while at the same time inspiring awe and wonder about the world around us I have recently described the story of our 2000 year long intellectual quest to explore the universe and unravel its mysteries as the greatest story ever told...so far, because it reflects the essential greatness of human civilization, along with the ever-changing nature of progress. In this journey, the arts and humanities are inextricably linked with science as we have bravely march together forward toward a future full of surprises that were previously unimagined.

To place our society's priorities so blatantly in favor of military defense while abandoning central features of what it is that makes our country worth defending reflects a fundamental antipathy toward science, the arts, and those features of our country that truly help make it great.

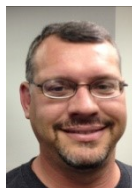
